

Tennis Europe Annual General Meeting in Sofia

Hosted by the Bulgarian Tennis Federation, the Annual General Meeting of Tennis Europe took place during the weekend of 31st March-1 April in Sofia.

Delegates from 35 of Tennis Europe's member nations attended the event, where a variety of key constitutional and operative matters were discussed.

In addition to the usual agenda of committee reports, a number of guest speakers were in attendance, including ITF Executive Vice-President Juan Margets, who gave a full update on recent ITF activities, Aleksei Selivanenko of the Russian Tennis Federation, informing the assembly about the boom in Russian tennis, and Dimitris Stamatiadis, the President of the Balkan Tennis Union.

Georgi Pirinski, Chairman of the National Assembly of the Republic of Bulgaria, formally opened the meeting, which received widespread national media attention throughout the two days.

Tennis Europe's President, John James (pictured) commented, "We have had a most productive few



days, and leave with very fond memories of our visit to Sofia. Along with Bulgarian Tennis Federation President Plamen Minchev and his senior staff, I was honoured to receive an audience with the President of the Republic of Bulgaria Georgi Parvanov, where we discussed the future growth of tennis (continues>>)

Applications to Host Junior Championships

As part of an ongoing effort to further enhance the organisation and profile of the Tennis Europe Junior Tour, third parties have been invited to apply to host some of the Tour's most presitigious events for the first time.

The European Junior Championships and Tennis Europe Junior Masters are two of the tour's flagship competitions, and are on offer on a three-year basis from 2007 onwards.

The bidding process is open to both traditional and non-traditional hosts of the events, including clubs, academies, tennis resorts and commercial entities. The only condition is that the national federation concerned must sanction the application at the final stage.

The Tennis Europe Junior Tour is the leading pan-European competitive forum for junior talent in any major sport. The tour is comprised of 287 tournaments, held simultaneously for boys and girls.

Participants earn ranking points according to their performances throughout the year, with the best eight players in each age category going on to compete for

the **Tennis Europe Junior Masters** title at the end of the season. Past winners such as Kim Clijsters and Rafael Nadal illustrate the calibre of the competition.

The other highlight of the Tennis Europe Junior Tour is the prestigious **European Junior Championships**, held in July, for players of 14, 16 and 18 & Under. Open to the top players of Tennis Europe's 48 member nations, the event - celebrating its 30th edition in 2006 - has seen a myriad of World #1s amongst its former participants, including Lendl, Edberg, Becker, Wilander, Moya, Graf, Sanchez-Vicario, Hingis, Seles, Federer, Safin, Henin-Hardenne, Dementieva.

Tennis Europe Junior Tour Promotion Officer David Albareda has begun his tour of European events with the Tennis Europe Junior Tour stand (pictured, with tournament organisers from the first port of call, the U14 event in Maia (POR).

The stand, part of a series of projects announced at the beginning of the year to promote the Tour, has so far visited events in Portugal, Italy and Croatia, where players were able to take advantage of giveaways and competitions, and to be photographed for a junior photo gallery, soon to be added to the Tennis Europe website.

Of his first three trips, Mr. Albareda said, "So far the stand has been very well received. It's a great way for us to promote the work of our organisation amongst the participants of the Junior Tour, and also their coaches and families, and the spectators. It's also very important to have the extra opportunity to liase in person with the tournament directors, and to hear



their ideas, concerns and hopes for the future."

Tennis Europe Junior Tour Stars vs. Champions

Two of the rising stars of the Tennis Europe Junior Tour recently got a taste of fame, playing an exhibition match in front of 6,700 people at a Nike Clinic at the recent Open SEAT 2006 in Barcelona.

Javier Martí and Carlos Boluda of Spain, both ranked in the Under 14 top ten following a string of good performances this spring, were joined by legend John

McEnroe, along with Feliciano Lopez and Carlos Moya for the match, played on the opening day of the event.

The pair played a tie-break with Lopez occupying the position of umpire before teaming for a doubles

match with their more experienced opponents.

Given their performances so far this season, it may not be long before the young Spaniards are making their own impact on the Barcelona event but, for now, it's back to the junior tour. (more on page 7).

The Women's 60 category is a new event, to be held for the first time this year.







ITF/Tennis Europe Development Championships, Tallinn

The 12th ITF/Tennis Europe 14 & Under Development Championships have been held for a second consecutive year at the Rocca al Mare Tennis Centre in Tallinn, Estonia. Hosted by the Estonian Tennis Association, the event took place from 10 - 19 March, when players from 18 Eastern European countries took part in two back-to-back tournaments in order to ensure maximum playing benefits.

The event is designed to benefit the top players from some of Europe's less-developed tennis nations. Top performing players at the event receive travel grants to help towards the often prohibitive costs of travel to international junior tennis tournaments.

Romanian players dominated the Championships, winning three of the four titles on offer. Unseeded Sebastian

Ionescu won the first tournament with a series of comfortable victories, with a final win over fourth seed Filip Krajinovic (SCG). Having brushed aside quarter and semi final opponents Arturs Kazjevs (LAT) and Nikolz Basilashvili (GEO) 60 60 and 61 61 respectively, his crushing 62 61 win in the final was no surprise.

The same two players fought their way to the final of the second event, where the tables were turned. Despite having taken the first set on a tie break, Ionescu, who had been made to fight in his previous matches, was unable to capitalise, and Krajinovic raised his game to exact revenge by the score of 67 63 61.

Thirteen-year old Romanian Ingrid Radu played excellently to dominate both girls events. A second round hiccup in the first event, edging past Ema Burgic (BIH) 64 36 75 paved the way for easy wins over second seed Diana Marcinkevica (LAT) and Alena Sotnikova (UKR) in the semis and final.

Radu then progressed with ease to the final of the second event, where she faced second eed Alena Sotnikova (UKR), and won in straight sets 62 64.

Tournament Director Rene Busch said: "Due to the feed-in format, the Development Championships are a great event especially for the players with less competitive opportunities. This also provided a unique op-

portunity for Estonian players and coaches to see some of the most promising European juniors."

There is lots of action to report on since the last newsletter, as springtime means the Tennis Europe Junior Tour moves into full swing after the sleepy winter months, which end with the Tennis Europe Winter Cups by Prince.

son so far, first in Tarbes and then at Maia where he beat – you guessed it – Martí. The pair teamed up to win the doubles there too, and both smashed into the top ten as a result.

Many players seem to have used good performances at the indoor season's biggest team event as a springboard for personal successes.

The Ren sisters, Jennifer and Jessica, who led Great Britain to the semi finals of the Girls 14 event, have had a busy time in Portugal. Jennifer reached the final of the Category 1 event in Maia, whilst Jessica reached the semi finals the next week in Angra Do Heroismo. They also teamed the reach the semis of the first event, and the final of the second. With those results, Jennifer broke into the top ten at #8, while Jessica rises to #44 this week.

A number of players can claim numerous titles this year already. #11 Timea Babos (HUN) has two Category 2 titles to her name, winning Messina and Bratislava in the last three weeks. Meanwhile, Ashot Khacharyan (RUS) won back-to-back titles on Italian

clay, sweeping Pavia and Livorno to pressurize compatriot Mikhail Biryukov for the U14 top spot. Together, the two have also won two Category 1 doubles titles, and look to be the pair to beat this year.

Another two fast rising players from the same country are Javier Martí and Carlos Boluda of Spain. You might have seen them already in this issue, in more glamourous locations with some famous friends.

Boluda has won two of the biggest titles of the sea-





Jennifer Ren and Ashot Khacharyan have both racked up some impressive results already this season.

Last week's title in Prague was the second of the year for Filip Strnad, who breaks into the top 30.

Other fast movers include #24 Ajla Tomljanovic, a winner in Maia and runner up in Zagreb, and Switzerland's Sarah Moundir, who won at home in Oetwil and was a runner-up in Angra Do Heroismo, to knock on the door of the top ten. She currently stands at #14.

The Under 16s, bigger and heavier creatures that they are, aren't so active at this time of year. Some of them are rumoured to be hibernating. Others have been found in strange places - #6 Gastao Elias, for example, recently won two rounds of qualifying at the ATP event in Estoril! Congratulations to him.

Some of last years top Under 14s are already making big strides in the next age category. Mirza Basic (BIH) won in Novi Sad two weeks ago,

while Simona Halep earned a first U16 title in Trenscianske Teplice.

Not many of the top Under 16 players have been in action yet, but you can expect that to change this month as the Tour finally wakes up with fourteen events scheduled this month.

Tennis Europe Junior Tour Rankings—14 & Under

This month's top tens feature a number of new entries as the early stages of the season sees some prolific first-time winners on the tour.

Incredibly, the Girls 14 & Under lists sees three halves of sets of sisters; Karolina Pliskova, Jennifer Ren and Nadegda Kickenok lead the way, whilst their relatives also all feature in the top 50.

Both 14 & Under #1s retain their positions this month, but both are coming under increasing pressure from the rest of the pack. Less than 80 points separeaates the entire girl's top ten, and with two Category 1 events amongst the 15 scheduled for May, there could be some big changes in prospect.

European Rankings

The dawning of the European clay court season has already had an impact at the top of the rankings this month.

Some of the best performers early on see their efforts pay off as they enter the top ten; Finland's Jarkko Niemenen recovered from a narrow loss against Rafael Nadal in Barcelona to reach the semi finals in Munich, whilst Barcelona runner-up Tommy Robredo re-enters the list at #5, breaking into the world's top ten for the first time. The successful defence of his Monte Carlo and Barcelona titles keep Nadal a strong #2, but Roger Federer continues to hold a record-breaking points total at the top.

In the women's list, Svetlana Kuznetsova's recent run of good form - winning the title in Miami before reaching the Warsaw final for a third consecutive year - sees her back in the European top ten, the last of four Russians.

Amelie Mauresmo has regained the top spot from Kim Clijsters, and looks set to be the top seed at her home Grand Slam in Paris for the first time later this month. Electing to skip Warsaw, where she was defending champion, sees current Roland Garros champion Justine Henin-Hardenne drop from third to seventh on the list.
