2002 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING - PREVIEW

Delegates from 39 member nations have confirmed their attendance to the 28th Annual General Meeting of Tennis Europe that will take place in Cambridge on March 15-17. With one week to go, the record number of 40 nations that were present in Barcelona two years ago could still be reached.

It will be the third time that the Lawn Tennis Association will host the AGM, after 1979 in Marlow and 1988 in Bath. The highlight of the social programme will certainly be the official dinner at Queens' College.

Elections for President, Committee of Management and Honorary Auditors will be the main issue of this year's AGM.

The candidates for Presidency will have the opportunity of making a short presentation to the delegates and answer questions from the floor on the Friday afternoon at the Open Session.

A presentation by the LTA about their project "Club Vision" as well as ITF matters will be the other items of the Open Session.

2002 EUROPEAN VETERANS INDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

The organizers of the Veterans Indoors in Austrian well known Ski Resort Seefeld could state that the number of participants in this event is still increasing. Even the figure of 655 players coming from 29 different countries did not cause any problems to the TC Seefeld and Tournament Director Kurt Winkler.

The elder age-groups were played in the first - and the younger ones in the second week of the competition. In addition to all the singles and doubles events – played in 18 (age) categories, 8 ladies and 10 men – also a Consolation and a Mixed Doubles Competition was organized.

The whole tournament was run very well and it was very much appreciated by the Players. Besides

the sport-activities in both weeks of the event, there was a reception held in the Seefeld – Casino and the traditional Players Party with dancing at the Klosterbräu Hotel right in the centre of Seefeld.

Many players left the party after midnight.

The oldest player came from Great Britain – 92 years old Peter Forda. Peter had a handicap playing quite younger opponents since this age-group started already with players of the age of 85.

The Veterans Committee of Tennis Europe held its meeting during this Championships in Seefeld and they all were impressed by the enthusiasm and the skills of all the participating players.

THE TWENTIETH ANNIVERSARY OF LES PETITS AS

In 1982, three young players and teachers from Tarbes had an ambitious idea, to create a tournament for young boys and girls from France but also from abroad.

Now twenty years later, Les Petits AS, which is played under the umbrella of Tennis Europe, is one of the best under 14 junior tournament in the world. Players like Martina Hingis, Anna Kurnikova, Juan — Carlos Ferrero, Kim Clijsters etc. won the tournament and many other famous players participated in this unique tournament. Nowadays the tournament has a huge budget and almost 40'000 spectators per year enjoy the atmosphere of this international event.

Tournament of the superlatives

Tarbes is not just a tournament, more than 7000 kids try to qualify in 50 venues to play the Main Draw in Tarbes. Players, who make it to the Main Draw, count as very promising and they are during the period of the tournament under the supervision of various sport management agencies, sporting

good manufacturers, national coaches etc. If you win the tournament you have the right to look into a bright future but still it is not a guarantee that you become one of tomorrows big stars.

"It is an amazing tournament. The quality of the Main Draws, the high standard of the facilities and all the activities like the exhibition match of the French Davis Cup heroes and the opening ceremony are just incredible. " commented Olli Mäenpää, Managing Director External Affairs of Tennis Europe.

14&Under Main Draw

This year Dylan Arnould (USA) won the boys singles tournament and Timea Bacsinszky (SUI) succeeded in the girls competition.

The boys doubles contest was won by the Croatian Grubisic/ Kovacic and the girls competition by the Russian Kosminskaia/ Makarova.

Unique Wheelchair Event

Since 17 years a wheelchair com-

petition takes place in conjunction with the Under 14 competition. This year Sweden's Stefan Olsson won the boys singles event.

Some of the best tennis of the tournament was in the girl's event. Kaitlyn Verfeurth (USA) won the singles in a closely contested final against Annick Sevenans (BEL) 64 36 75.

Stefan Olsson added the doubles title to his singles victory. Germany's Thomas Nolte partnered him. They beat in the final Stephen Coll and Danny Fik in a very close affair.

In the girls doubles Alexandra Blickle (GER) and Annick Sevenans (BEL) beat Kaitlyn Verfeurth and Elizabeth Williams 76 64.

WHEELCHAIR TENNIS - PLAYERS CHOICE AWARD

The 2001 ITF World Champion, Esther Vergeer (NED), and three-time World Champion David Hall (AUS) have become the first recipients of a new award voted for by players on the NEC Wheel-chair Tennis Tour. The Players Choice Awards were introduced by the ITF in 2001 to mark the 25th anniversary of wheelchair tennis. They will be presented with their awards at one of the up-

coming events on the NEW Wheelchair Tennis Tour.

In another category, the players chose the British Open, Nottingham, England as Tournament of the Year. Voting for these new awards is based on criteria such as fair play and the player's contribution to the development of wheelchair tennis. The tournament of the year is awarded to a

tournament on the NEC Tour that is acknowledged for quality of the organisation and it's contribution to the development of wheelchair tennis at a national or international level. The British Open, held at the City of Nottingham Tennis Centre, has long been recognised for very high standards and in particular the standard of officiating. (Mark Bullock)

8th ITF / TENNIS EUROPE DEVELOPMENT CHAMPIONSHIPS – 14 & UNDER

During the second and third week of January, twenty-six boys and girls battled hard at the 8th ITF / Tennis Europe Development Championships for a chance to win a place on the much coveted ITF / Tennis Europe 14 & Under Team.

The two 5-day tournaments, hosted by the Lithuanian Tennis Union for the second successive year were held in Siauliai. Lithua-

nia from 7 – 18 January and saw some 13 East European nations participating in what is one of the highlights of the ITF / Tennis Europe calendar.

"The level of play was extremely high and there were some very interesting matches from the very first day" commented Luca Santilli, ITF / Tennis Europe Development Officer for Europe who was in Siauliai to oversee the smooth running of the event.

He went onto say: "All the players were very motivated and proud to have been nominated by their respective Federations to participate in this important competition."

Belarus were the 'dream team' of the first week, taking first place in both the boys' and girls' events. Novikov Dmitri (BLR) secured first place in the boys' event by defeating Dejan Katic from Yugoslavia in three tough sets in the semi-finals and Sergeyev Ivan from the Ukraine in the final, who despite his powerful game could not overcome the speed of the Belarussian player.

In the girls' event, Gavartsova Volma (BLR) lost only one set on her way to victory, defeating Corduneanu Corina from Romania in the final in two straight sets.

Following the completion of the two-week competition, players who have performed well at the 14 & Under event will be invited to be a member of an ITF / Tennis Europe Team who will compete in 5-weeks of top level events as part of the European Junior tour in Europe during the summer.

14 & UNDER ITF/TENNIS EUROPE NORTH EAST REGIONAL TRAINING CAMP

The ITF / Tennis Europe training camp for 14 & Under players in north east Europe was held for the second successive year in Siauliai, Lithuania from 4 – 9 February.

Thirty-two players from Estonia, Latvia, Belarus and Ukraine were invited to Lithuania to attend the beautiful Siauliai Tennis School for the camp. The camp was conducted by Luca Santilli, ITF / Tennis Europe Development Officer together with ten national coaches from the each of the invited countries. Players and coaches were involved in both on-court and off-court training sessions, covering a number of different topics including movement practice and footwork, coordination skills, mental psychological training, tactical patterns on hard court and practising the five games situation. The aim of this project is to recreate the

successful training camps that were held regularly in this part of Europe before the break-up of the USSR.

Luca Santilli said: "The training camp provides players and coaches from the region with a rare opportunity not only to work and train together but also to exchange information".

2002 EUROPEAN COACHES SYMPOSIUM

TENNIS EUROPE is very pleased to announce that the 26th European Coaches Symposium will be held in Vale do Lobo, Portugal from 12-17 October 2002.

The European Coaches Symposium on this occasion will be organised by Tennis Europe in conjunction with the Portugal Tennis Federation.

It is the third time, following the 1982 and 1988 editions respectively held in Vilamoura and Madeira that this high level technical conference is hold in Portugal. The renowned tourist resort of Val de Lobo (Algarve) and also host of one of the ATP Senior Tour tournaments is situated in one of the most unspoiled regions of the Portuguese golden stretch of coastline in the south of Portugal (20 km from the international airport of Faro).

This beautiful scenario of beach-dunes, golf courses and

ocean views, will provide participants with all the comforts and facilities such as: outdoor courts, conference hall for 200 people, gym, golf-course, accommodation in independent modern villa, restaurants and bars.

Following the success of the 2000 edition which took place in Otocec Slovenia, the format of the four days long European tennis conference that deals with the development of high performance players and updates on the latest research in the coaching field will feature three distinctive parts (general/ specific/scientific) with lectures and on-court presentations on different topics of general interest in tennis, on various areas of tennis sport science and on specific topics presented by top international experts mainly from Europe.

Detailed information together with a tentative programme of the conference will be air-

mailed to all TENNIS EUROPE member nations, early in May. Applications to attend the workshop must come to the TENNIS EUROPE Headquarters in Basel via National Associations. Closing date for entries is Friday 26 July 2002. Therefore, any coaches wishing to apply to attend the Symposium should contact their National Association immediately.

The jointly funded ITF/Tennis Europe Development Programme will provide accommodation and travelling grants to attend the conference for delegates of selected European member nations.
