The future for European professional tennis is extremely bright. We can see that more players are coming to the top of the rankings. Three of the top five players in the ATP rankings are European and two of the five in women's tennis.

However, it is not only at the top of the game that we can see Europe shining. We can see that Europe is a driving force in all aspects of the game. I think European tennis

NEWS FROM VETERANS TENNIS

The ETA Veterans Committee met in **Seefeld** (Austria) on January 17th, 2001, taking the opportunity to visit the European Indoor Championships.

This year Seefeld Tennis Club was celebrating the 25th Anniversary of the European Championships. They were not left alone to celebrate as a record of 645 participants turned up in this beautiful ski resort in the Tyrolean Alps.

The results of the Championships can be viewed on our website.

The Veterans Committee approved the Veterans Rankings valid for 2001. These are based on the results from the 77 tournaments which are part of the 2000 European Veterans Circuit: 533 draws data with more than 10.000 results were considered for establishing 20 different ranking lists, 9 age categories for ladies and 11 age categories for men. The Veterans data now includes approx. 13800 players.

The five best results head-tohead as well as bonus points for the rounds achieved at three tournaments are counted for calculating the rankings.

The Committee also confirmed the categories of the tournaments part of the **2001 European Veterans Circuit**.

The Circuit comprises this year a total of 50 tournaments and 9 European Championships, including the European Veterans Clubs Championships. The dates and venues are available from page ten.

Another task of the Committee was to finalise the criteria of **the EUROPEAN VETER-** ANS FUND: thanks to the generosity of one person having a big heart for Veterans Tennis the ETA will be able to allocate grants to Clubs not able to participate in the European Veterans Clubs Championships due to lack of financial means. This scheme will be started this year and specific criteria for the allocation of the grants have been worked out by the Veterans Committee. The detailed information will be sent to the ETA Member Nations in due course.

You will find on page three the list of the **2000 PLAY-ERS OF THE YEAR**, who are the players ranked first on the rankings. We would like to congratulate them for their performance and wish them good luck for the upcoming tournaments.

ITF/ETA NORTH EAST REGIONAL TRAINING CAMP FOR PLAYERS 14 & UNDER

The first ITF/ETA training camp for players 14 & Under in north east Europe was held in Siauliai - two hours drive from the capital city Vilnius - Lithuania from 14 - 21 January.

The idea behind the camp was to re-create the successful training camps that were regularly held in this part of Europe at the time of the USSR, where coaches and players from the former Soviet Republics gathered to train to-gether.

Thirty-two players from Estonia, Latvia, Belarus and Ukraine were invited to Lithuania to the beautiful Siualiai Tennis School. The school has excellent facilities including accommodation/restaurant/TV/games room facilities, four indoor and six outdoors courts, two gyms, sauna and a small swimming pool. The camp was conducted by Luca Santilli, the ITF/ETA Development Officer who, together with 10 national coaches from the invited countries, made sure that the players' training was high quality and intense. The weekly programme comprised 48 on court and 10 off court sessions, with each player being involved in 24 on court and 5 off court training sessions.

The project had great press coverage throughout the week, especially when the Mayor of Siauliai called a press conference at the Municipality.

It was an unique occasion for players and coaches from the Region to work together and exchange information, experiences and to play some matches of course!

ETA WOMEN'S OFFICE COORDINATOR MEETS ITALIAN TOUR-NAMENT DIRECTORS IN ROME

Foro Italico, the beautiful site of the Italian Open, hosted a meeting of the Tournament Directors of ITF Women's Circuit events held in Italy organized by Federazione Italiana Tennis.

Italy can be proud to play a leading role in staging women's events in Europe. In 2000, 32 events were held. For 2001, the even more optimistic plan is to hold 34 events offering a total of 710.000 US\$ in prize money which is more than 20% of the entire European circuit. 27 Tournament Directors from all over Italy, the General Secretary of FIT Mr. Mario Orienti, the Tournament Department Director Mr. Massimo Verdina, General Manager Mr. Adriano Panatta, Circuit Coordinators Mr. Cirillo Raffaele and Mrs. Stefania Macrini.

The aim of the conference was to discuss ways to improve organisation and promotion of women's events.

Martina Alterova, the Coordinator of the ETA Women's Department, was invited to attend the meeting and to update the audience on the 2001 ITF Women's Circuit rule changes, as well as the work of the ETA Women's Department. Martina delivered her two presentations, with Luca Santilli, ITF/ETA Development Officer, acting as an interpreter.

The meeting proved to be a success, enabling the Federation officials, Tournament Directors and the ETA Women's Department to get to know each other better and to bring new suggestions for improvement of the European women's tennis.


